fiercer	(when comparing two people) the more brutal, the stronger, the more vicious
heir	next person in line to be monarch
industry	factories that change materials into objects e.g. cloth into clothes
invasion	entering another county with armed forces
monarch	a monarchy is a form of government that has a single person known as a monarch (king or queen) at its head

Queen Victoria	Queen of England 1837-1901
reign	how long a king or queen is monarch for
significant	important
trade	buying or selling of goods
