### Key Vocabulary:

Spelling:	Definition:
In the past; a long time ago; modern; old; living memory; decades; similar; different; in my lifetime; significant; artefact; consequence; impact	Generic language used in Y2 history lessons.
Semi-detached	Two houses joined together on one side only by a common wall.
Detached	A house standing alone, separate from other houses.
Terraced	A house built as part of a continuous row in a uniform style.
Cottage	A small house, typically one in the country
Chimney	A vertical channel or pipe which conducts smoke up from a fire and through the roof of a building.
Pantry	A small room or cupboard in which food, crockery, and cutlery are kept.
Crockery; cutlery	Plates, bowls, cups etc.; knives and forks
Fireplace	A place for a domestic fire, especially a grate or hearth at the base of a chimney.
Coal fire	A mass of burning coal used esp. in a hearth to heat a room.
