Key Vocabulary:	
Printing	The process of pressing an object to make a copy of a shape or image.
Repeating	To do something again.
Overlapping	To cover part of something.
Techniques	Apply procedures/methods to create a desired result.
Press	Steadily apply weight
Roll	Move along a surface by turning over
Rub	Move back and forth along a surface.
Stamp	Move downwards with force.
Primary colour	3 colours that can be mixed to make another colour – red, blue and yellow

Objectives (key knowledge):					
To know what printing is and how it is created. To know how to mix primary colours.	To learn how to create a colour wheel.	To learn which objects to use to create prints (e.g. fruit, vegetable or sponges).	To know what techniques and tools to use in order to press, roll, rub and stamp to make prints.	To know how to use repeating or overlapping shapes.	To learn to mimic print from the environment (e.g. wallpapers).
