



British Values Statement

At Intake Farm Primary School we value the ethnic backgrounds of all pupils and families and undertake a variety of events and lessons to celebrate and explore these alongside other cultures in our country. Teachers endeavor to locate and use a range of resources to promote understanding of different faiths. We have found this approach to be enriching for all children as it teaches tolerance and respect for the differences in our wider community and the world. Underpinning this, we teach a range of curriculum topics which develop the spiritual, moral, social and cultural education of our children.

At Intake Farm Primary School, we value the voice of the child and promote democratic processes such as our school council whose members are voted for by the children. Ideas and events are planned and discussed with a chance for debate and putting forward points of view. We expect all our children to be good role models for each other, which is encouraged through high expectations of behaviour.

As a whole school, we have celebrated the Olympics, with Olympic themed sports days, opportunities to learn about the history of Olympians in this country and focus on the Paralympics. There is a range of after school clubs and activities that children can take part in.

Each year, we take part in the annual Remembrance Day where children purchase poppies and a minute's silence is held in specially created assemblies for the school.

On a more general level, the school undertakes daily assemblies which uphold traditional values of empathy, respect and tolerance. These are also taught within formal SEAL, PSHE and RE lessons and on an informal nature throughout the school day.
