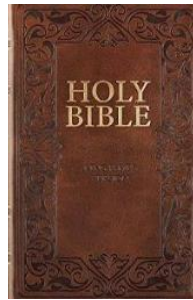


1- RE: 2.4 ‘How and why are some stories important in religions?’ ‘What can we learn from stories from the Torah and the Bible?’

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Bible	The holy book of the Christian religion consisting of the Old and New Testaments.
Christianity	The religion based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ, or its beliefs and practices.
Church	The building associated with Christian worship.
Judaism	The monotheistic religion of the Jewish people.
Sacred	Considered to be holy and deserving respect, especially because of a connection with a god:
Synagogue	The building where a Jewish assembly or congregation meets for religious worship and instruction.
Torah	The first five books of the Jewish Bible that deal with the law of God.
Worship	Religious rites or ceremonies, constituting a formal expression of reverence for a deity.
