Artefact	An object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.
Celebration	The action of celebrating an important day or event.
Christianity	The religion based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ, or its beliefs and practices.
Church	The building associated with Christian worship.
Festival	A day or period of celebration, typically for religious reasons.
Judaism	The monotheistic religion of the Jewish people.
Sacred	considered to be holy and deserving respect, especially because of a connection with a god:
Synagogue	The building where a Jewish assembly or congregation meets for religious worship and instruction.
Worship	religious rites or ceremonies, constituting a formal expression of reverence for a deity
