Account	An arrangement with a bank to keep your money there and allow you to take it out when you need to.
Bank	A business for holding, borrowing or exchanging money.
Credit cards	A plastic card which allows customers to borrow a certain amount of money from banks.
Debit cards	A plastic card which is used to withdraw money from your bank account.
Electronic payment	A way to pay for items without using cash. This can be done with a card, phone or watch. The money comes out of the bank account.
Need	Something essential to survive.
Want	Things that are nice to have but not essential to survival.
Save	To put money aside and not use it straight away.
Spend	Buying something using your money.
