



Key Vocabulary:

Family	A family is a group of people who are related to each other, like parents and their children.
Blended family	A blended family is when one or both parents have children from a previous relationship, and they come together to form a new family.
Foster	To foster means to take care of a child who cannot live with their own parents, usually for a temporary period.
Adopt	To adopt is to legally take a child into your family as your own child, even though they are not your biological child.
Same sex family	A same-sex family is when two people of the same gender, like two dads or two mums, are raising children together.
Support	To support means to help someone by being there for them or providing assistance.
Stability	Stability means being steady and not likely to change or fall apart; it is a feeling of safety and security.
Care	To care means to look after someone or something and make sure they are safe and healthy.
Boundaries	Boundaries are lines or limits that show where something begins or ends, or rules about what is acceptable.
Privacy	Privacy means keeping some things to yourself or having space that is not shared with others.

To know that being part of a family provides support, stability and love and about the positive aspects of being part of a family.	To learn about different ways that people can care for each other. To learn what is appropriate to share with friends, classmates, family and wider social groups including online. To know what privacy and personal boundaries are.	To learn basic strategies to help keep themselves safe online for example; passwords, using trusted sites, adult supervision.
