



Key Vocabulary:	
Attitudes	Manner, disposition, feeling, position, etc., with regard to a person or thing; tendency or orientation, especially of the mind.
Community	A social group of any size whose members reside in a specific locality, share government, and often have a common cultural and historical heritage.
Diversity	The fact of many different types of things or people being included in something; a range of different things or people.
Empathy	The ability to share someone else's feelings or experiences by imagining what it would be like to be in that person's situation.
Identity	A person's name and other facts about who they are.
Inclusion	The act of including someone or something as part of a group, list, etc.
Influence	The power to have an effect on people or things, or a person or thing that is able to do this.
Perspective	A particular way of considering something.
Qualities	A characteristic or feature of someone or something.
Racism	A belief that differences among the various human racial groups determine cultural or individual achievement.
Skills	An ability to do an activity or job well, especially because you have practised it.
Stereotypes	A set idea that people have about what someone or something is like, especially an idea that is wrong.
