afford	To have enough money to pay for something.

censorship	The process of blocking something from being read, heard or seen.
cost of living	The level of prices relating to everyday items: housing, food and taxes.
debt	Money that has been borrowed and is owed to someone else.
in debt	Being unable to pay the money that is owed to someone else.
economical	Using money carefully so there is little or no waste.
loan	A sum of money that is borrowed (from banks, individuals or companies) to financially manage planned or unplanned events.
overdrawn	Taking more money out of a bank account than the account contained.
propaganda	The spreading of ideas, information or rumour to influence a person's opinions, attitudes or behaviour.
standard of living	The level of comfort and goods that a person or group has access to.
value	This is how much something is worth.
